AN IMPORTANT NOTE FROM THE GARDENS TEAM:

"Dear members: We have a lot less variety this fall than we were hoping for due to weather fluctuations, earlier than usual cool weather, bacterial fungus impacting our winter squash plants, and cabbage moths wiping out our kale crop. We have a new kale crop started and we are hoping it will grow in time for the later weeks of our Fall CSA. All this said, we want to express our gratitude for your willingness to weather these issues as part of the shared risk model of Community Supported Agriculture. Your loyalty and support mean so much, and we look forward to providing you with as much sustainably grown, delicious produce as possible this season!"
